

### **Research Note**

  - Instruction in word-learning strategies (e.g., using context)
  - 4. Fostering word consciousness (i.e., promoting an interest in words and their meanings).



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
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
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

#### **Goal & Purpose**

The goal of Vocabulary instruction is to provide students with an understanding of the meaning and use of words so that they can comprehend what they are reading and communicate effectively. Vocabulary is critical to teach because of its connection to overall reading comprehension (NRP, 2000; Rand Study Group, 2002; Snow, Burns, & Griffin, 1998). That is, if a word is decoded and pronounced but the meaning is not recognized, comprehension will be impaired. *Reference: FCRR Teacher Resource Guide, 2007.*






#### Full Definition of CATEGORIZE
