

### **TLI Goals**



- 1. Increase the oral language and preliteracy skills of participating preschool children.
- 2. **Improve** the performance of participating **K-2 students** on early reading assessments.
- 3. **Increase** the percentage of participating students who meet or exceed proficiency on the state English language arts assessments in grades 3 through 12.
- 4. **Increase** the use of data and data analysis to inform all decision making in participating districts, campuses, classrooms, and early learning settings.
- 5. **Increase** the implementation of effective literacy instruction through *Literacy Lines*.








## Preliminary TLI Numbers




#### Site/Campus-based Leadership Team (CbLT) • Literacy Leadership from Each Site/Campus in the Literacy Line






## **CBLT/ Campus Based Leadership Team**





#### Ideas on How Parents can Support the TLI

- 1. Take your child to the public library on a regular basis. The library has various activities which promote reading. Ask for the calendar of events.
- 2.Brownsville's Public Library has a department called "Friends of the Library" where you can buy books or magazines for as little as ten cents.
- 3. Contact your child's teacher to find out what level of fluency he/she has.
- 4. Make time to D.E.A.R. Drop Everything and Read at home for 15 minutes each day. Turn off the television, radio, electronic games, etc.
- 5. Try to read to your child and ask him/her comprehension questions.
