



Routine for Explicit Vocabulary Instruction

	Steps	Tips														
1.	Have students say the word.															
2.	Provide a definition of the word using student-friendly explanations and visuals .	Use a Post-It to help plan your instruction. 														
3.	Have students discuss what is known about the word.															
4.	Provide examples and nonexamples of the word.															
5.	Engage in deep-processing activities by asking questions , using graphic organizers , or having students act out the word.	<p>Choose a deep-processing word from the box.
